SEEKING EXPRESSIONS OF INTEREST - COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT CONSULTANT.

The Northern Rivers BioHubs Consortium (Lead Agency Nimbin Neighbourhood and Information Centre) has been funded by the NSW Office and Environment and Regional Development Australia Northern Rivers to undertake the NR Bio Hubs project.

The project involves pre-feasibility investigations into 3 potential biogas projects in the Northern Rivers – at Nimbin, Casino and Murwillumbah.

The project also involves determining the extent to which the community of the NR, particularly in the above 3 locations, is likely to grant a social license for bioenergy projects and any parameters or conditions impacting on their consent.

The project steering committee seeks expressions of interest from experienced consultants to undertake a community consultation process as identified in the Social License Community Consultations Implementation Plan.

Background Information

The Northern Rivers region of NSW is a significant agricultural & horticultural production area which generates large volumes of biomass from growing, harvesting, processing and manufacturing of food and fibre. With energy being the major input for those businesses processing or value adding, and a strong community appetite for low carbon energy supplies to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, there is a growing need for the region to identify new and emerging options for cost-effective renewables. There is an equally strong appetite for market investment and/or community ownership or participation in energy generation facilities.

The NSW North Coast Bio Energy Scoping Study provided high level research into the potential, opportunities and challenges of industries in the region that have biomass or biogas resources with potential for stationary bioenergy. The study found that annual energy generation of approximately 1,100 GWh could be achieved for feedstocks including forest residues and sawmill waste, sugar cane and municipal solid waste. The report also identified significant opportunities for the development of regional bioenergy facilities, located close to the biomass resource to reduce material supply



costs. This ultimately led to the formation of the Northern Rivers Bio-Hub Consortium.

There are a number of bio-product projects established or emerging in the region, including the Condong & Broadwater Sugar Cogeneration plants, a 150 kW steam turbine near Tweed Heads operated by BORAL and a macadamia shell fired boiler near Lismore.

Project Client

The client in this project is Nimbin Neighbourhood and Information Centre (NNIC) on behalf of the Northern Rivers Bio–Hub Consortium.

Schedule of Work

It is expected that the work will take place within a 6 month period starting in August 2015 and aiming to complete by February 2016.

Deliverables

The Community Engagement Consultant will be required to perform Tasks numbered 6-21 in the attached Implementation Plan. A budget of \$4,300 has been allocated to cover implementation costs such as venues and catering.

It is proposed that payment to the CEC will be made according to the achievement of milestones as set out in the table below.
